

Subject: **Report from further Investigation from Nimba Visionary Herbalist**

Sir, we present our compliments and herewith submit to you conclusions and recommendations reached at end of our inquiry into revelation made by Nathan Paye Sayegon, a resident of Tunudin Town, Kpain Township, Nimba County, who proclaims of having a vision for cure for the deadly Ebola virus.

He told our inquiry that he reportedly obtained the cure physically and through dream upon spiritual instruction.

According to Sayegon, the instruction to him further states that upon approval by authorities, treatment should start with residents of Monrovia who have been diagnosed Ebola positive.

Following his long deliberation and questioning, we concluded on the following:

1. There is no scientifically proven cure for the deadly Ebola yet.
2. We don't know the potency of the medicine that Saygon is said to have.
3. We cannot doubt the efficacy of Saygon's medicine or his vision.

4. There is no empirical evidence that this medicine will work successfully or not.
5. We are not doctors and/or scientists or herbalists and /or native healers.
6. The Government of Liberia is desperately seeking all practical remedial solution to this menace.

We therefore recommend that following for your consideration:

1. That all discussions surrounding this vision be void of publicity or any kind.
2. That Sayegon be allowed to perform trial on at least four positive Ebola patients.
3. That the above mentioned trial be performed secretly or quietly, not involving media, Ministry of Health or health practitioner/Medical Doctors.
4. That before the experimental version, Sayegon should be given PPEs for his personal safety.
5. That Sayegon's vision and initial application of his medicine should not be alleviated to the level of the President until a successful trial is completed and it turns out to be effective.
